OVERVIEW

The 2001-02 total for home education students in Pennsylvania was 23,903. The total was comprised of 12,117 males and 11,786 females. This was a decrease of 116 students from the 2000-01 total of 24,019. Prior to 2001-02, the total for Pennsylvania home education students had increased every year since the passage of Act 169 of 1988, which authorized parents, guardians and legal custodians to teach their children at home. There was a 3.0% growth rate between 1999-00 and 2000-01, however there was a 0.5% decline from 2000-01 to 2001-02.

Data was collected from all of Pennsylvania's 501 school districts for home education students aged 5 through 21. Austin Area, Bristol Borough, Clairton City, Forest Area and Riverside were the only school districts that reported no home education students in 2001-02.

The number of home education students increased in 34 of Pennsylvania's 67 counties. Once again, Lancaster County led the state with 2,449 students followed by York County with 1,442 (see figure 2, page 4). Students educated at home comprised an additional 1.1% of the state's public, private and nonpublic enrollments in 2001-02 (see figure 5, page 8).


There were 233 school districts (46.5%), up from 224, that allowed home education students to participate in curricular programs, while 242 (48.3%), up from 233, allowed them to participate in extracurricular activities (see table 2, page 9). Some districts that allowed participation had restrictions.

The total number of home education students increased every year since the passage of Act 169 of 1988 until 2001-02. In 1992-93, there were 8,468 children who were educated at home. The 2001-02 total of 23,903 was a one-year decrease of 116 from the 2000-01 total of 24,019.



The number of home education students decreased in nine of the fourteen age categories. The only age categories that showed an increase were ages 6, 11, 13, 17 and 18+.

When home education statistics were first collected for the 1988-89 school year, nearly 70% of the students were age 11 and under. For the 2001-02 school year, the percentage had fallen to 48.6%.



The distribution of home education students showed that ages eight through thirteen had the largest numbers with age eleven having the most students. These ages accounted for 62.2% of the home education students. The Pennsylvania Public School Code of 1949, as amended, does not require a child to be registered for school until age eight. This accounted for the relatively low number of students registered in ages five, six and seven.


HOME EDUCATION STUDENTS BY SELECTED COUNTIES

Lancaster, Allegheny and York counties contained the largest concentration of home education students in 2001-02. These three counties represented 21.7% of the 23,903 home education students. Lancaster County has had the largest number every year since the passage of Act 169 of 1988. One of every ten home educated students resides in Lancaster County. Trends for these three counties closely paralleled the overall rise in the number of home education students for the entire state.

There were 2,051,726 children enrolled in grades K-12 in Pennsylvania in 1992-93. In that year, home education enrollments numbered 8,468, or just over 0.4% of the total enrollment. By 2001-02, the number of home education students had risen to 23,903, which comprised an additional 1.1% of the total public, private and nonpublic enrollment of 2,142,718. The percentage of home education students had been increasing by nearly 0.1 percentage point each year but has leveled off the last two years.

APPENDIX B

GLOSSARY

ACT 169 OF 1988 - Created a home education category designed to permit parents, guardians and legal custodians to conduct a home education program for their children.

CURRICULAR MATERIALS – Copies of the planned courses, textbooks and other materials appropriate to the student's age and grade level that are available to be borrowed from the school district.

CURRICULAR PROGRAMS – A series of planned instruction that is coordinated and articulated and implemented in a manner designed to result in the achievement by all students of specific knowledge and skills and the application of this knowledge.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES – Officially approved organized student activities connected with the school and usually carrying no academic credit.

HOME EDUCATION AFFIDAVIT – A notarized document filed by a child's parent, guardian or legal custodian. It contains the name of the home education supervisor, each child by name and age, as well as the address and phone number of the program site. The affidavit must contain an outline of proposed educational objectives, by subject area, for the subjects required by law. These subjects are to be offered in the English language. It will show evidence of the child's immunization and that the child has received health services. The supervisor must provide assurance that the education program meets the requirements of Act 169 of 1988, as well as certify that all adults living in the home and other custodial adults have not been convicted of a criminal offense listed in Section III(E) of Act 34 of 1985 within the last five years preceding the date of submission.

HOME EDUCATION SUPERVISOR – The parent, guardian or legal custodian who has broad responsibility for the education of the child. This person must hold a high school diploma or its equivalent.

HOME EDUCATION EVALUATOR – A teacher or administrator who has at least two years of experience in grading subjects. This includes evaluating classwork, homework, quizzes, classwork-based tests and prepared tests related to classwork subject matter.
