PDE announced **changes to the basic skills certification testing policies** on October 28, 2016 that are effective immediately and retroactively.

New SAT Scores effective February 29, 2016

SAT Section	Score
Reading	27
Mathematics	26
Writing & Language	28

New ACT Writing Score effective August 31, 2016

ACT Test	Score
Reading	22
Mathematics	21
Writing	8

Basic Skills Mixed Test Composite Scores

We have changed the method for calculating composite scores for all basic skills tests. The new method is simple:

- Add up the three passing scores for your best reading, writing and mathematics test to calculate the composite score needed
- Achieve no less than the minimum composite score on each of the three tests, plus
- Achieve scores that add up to the composite total or higher

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Examples:

Mixed Test Example	Required Passing Score	Minimum Composite Score	Student's Score
SAT Reading (March 2016)	27	25	27
CORE Writing	162	158	160
PPST Mathematics	173	170	176
New Composite:	362	Earned Composite:	363

Mixed Test Notes:

- Different test companies may be used
- Old and new tests may be combined

The minimum composite score is one standard error of measurement less than the required passing score.

Single Test Example	Required Passing Score	Minimum Composite Score	Student's Score
PAPA Reading	220	193	212
PAPA Writing	220	192	240
PAPA Mathematics	193	176	184
New Composite:	633	Earned Composite:	636

Tips on using the [Composite Score Calculator](#)

- When a candidate enters a basic skills score for Reading, Mathematics, and Writing using different tests, the “Qualifies for Mixed Score Option” column displays “Yes” if the score entered is equal or higher than the required qualifying score.
- The “Qualifies for Mixed Score Option” column remains **blank** when the score does not meet the required qualifying score.
- The “Qualifies for Mixed Score Option” column remains blank when the student’s scores for Reading, Mathematic, and Writing are from the same test series.
- Refer to the “**Qualification Rules**” **tab** in the calculator for the required passing and minimum scores for each test.

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Additional Testing Announcements

- **Vocational candidates** may take advantage of the mixed test composite policy; however, they must meet the minimum composite scores.
- **Mid-Level 7-9 tests**, formerly taken for certification and most recently for HQT, may be used as a Grades 4-8 concentration test if the candidate registered or passed the test prior to September 1, 2016.
- **Instructional Add-Ons**. PDE will approve add-on subjects included with a Pennsylvania approved program application when:
 - (1) The add-on subject passing test scores are present when the application is evaluated;
and
 - (2) The recommending institution indicates which subjects are being added in the comment box.
