2016-17 ECYEH Unique and Duplicate Counts by County

For the 2016-17 program year, there was a total unique count of 30,264 children and youth identified as experiencing homelessness and served by Pennsylvania’s Education for Children and Youth Experiencing Homelessness program. The population includes children under the age of five and youth enrolled in pre-K through grade 13. The unique count is based on where the child or youth was identified as homeless AND attributed to the entity (shelter, early intervention, pre-K program, etc.) or LEA (school district, comprehensive technical school, or charter/cyber charter school) based on either their Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) being attributed to that LEA or where the individual was identified or enrolled the longest. The unique count is used for SEA (state) reporting in EDFacts. The ‘where identified’ (duplicate) count is where the individual was identified as homeless; they may be identified in more than one LEA or entity. Children and youth identified by multiple entities are reported with their LEA(s), when applicable. The duplicated count is used for LEA reporting in EDFacts.
