### 2017-18 ECYEH Unique and Duplicate Counts by County

For the 2017-18 program year, there was a total unique count of 36,823 children and youth identified as experiencing homelessness and served by Pennsylvania's Education for Children and Youth Experiencing Homelessness (ECYEH) program. The population includes children under the age of five and youth enrolled in pre-K through grade 12. The unique count is based on where the child or youth was identified as homeless AND attributed to the entity (shelter, early intervention, pre-K program, etc.) or local education agency (LEA) (school district, comprehensive technical school, or charter/cyber charter school) based on either their Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) being attributed to that LEA or where the child or youth was identified or enrolled the longest. The unique count is used for state education agency (SEA) EDFacts reporting. The 'where identified' (duplicate) count is where the child or youth was identified as homeless; children or youth may be identified in more than one LEA or entity. Children and youth identified by multiple entities are reported with their LEAs, when applicable. The duplicate count is used for LEA EDFacts reporting.
