Insight PA Cyber Charter School uses the accrual method of accounting. The school utilized the *Sage Intacct* accounting application until February of 2020. In February 2020 the school switched to *Netsuite* that allows for alignment with the PDE's Chart of Accounts, along with being fully compliant with PA, GASB, and GAAP reporting requirements. The *Netsuite* secure, cloud-based financial management application includes accounting, cash management, purchasing, vendor management, financial consolidation, revenue recognition,

contract management, project accounting, fund accounting, inventory management, and financial reporting functions.
